**TREASURER'S/MEMBERSHIP REPORT**

Mick reported that the question was raised at the last meeting if the County Road 38 bridge in Currie would be widened for bicyclists and pedestrians. Amy had talked with Randy Groves, Murray County Engineer who said the bridge reconstruction is scheduled for several years out and will be paid for with state bonding dollars that will only allow a 32" wide

2. Drone Flyover – Terry Thone was unable to attend the meeting.
3. DNR Update – Roseann Schauer reported that Chris has walked the Lake Wilson segment of the Casey Jones Trail and there is a cement culvert that has collapsed. He will have a resource assessment ready by October/November.  
Chris is also waiting until the next round of paving projects are done to see if there is any money left over to repair the Six-Mile Loop trail.
4. Pipestone Trailhead – It was determined that Chris will need to put in a request to the design team before any paving, curbing, benches, etc can be done at the trailhead.
5. Lake Wilson Sign – Discussion was held on moving forward with the design of the sign.  
**Motion was made by Lee, seconded by Roseann and unanimously carried to proceed with the design of the sign for review at our next meeting.**

6. Woodstock Council Meeting – The Woodstock city council meets the third Thursday of every month. Melissa and Deb will attend the meeting and give a short presentation regarding the trail.
7. Meeting with Brad K and Dan Wildermuth – Melissa mentioned she knows the Kruisselbrink family and feels comfortable talking with Brad regarding an easement on his property to bring the trail through Woodstock.
